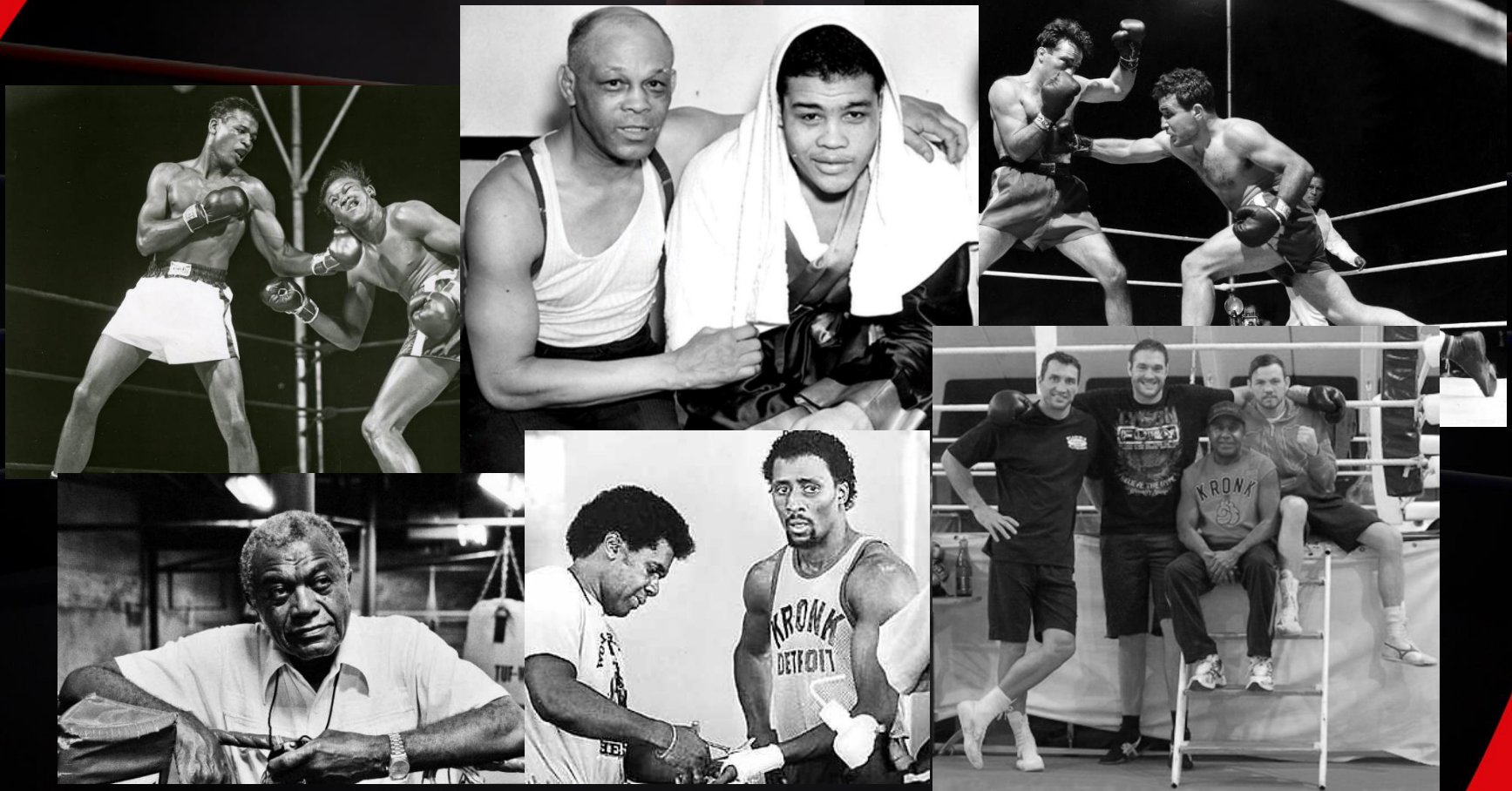

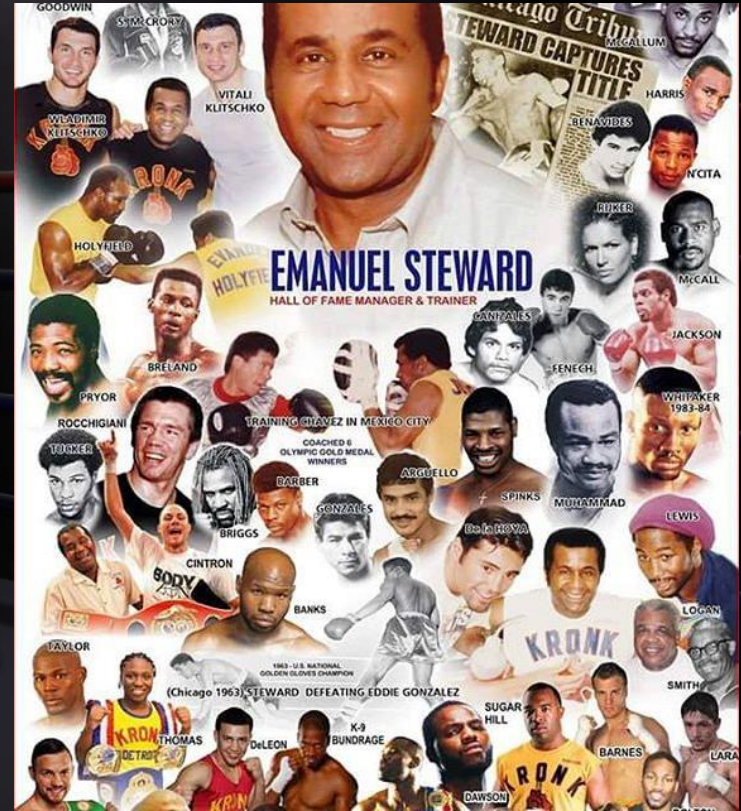

All roads to greatness in the sport of boxing come through the City of Detroit

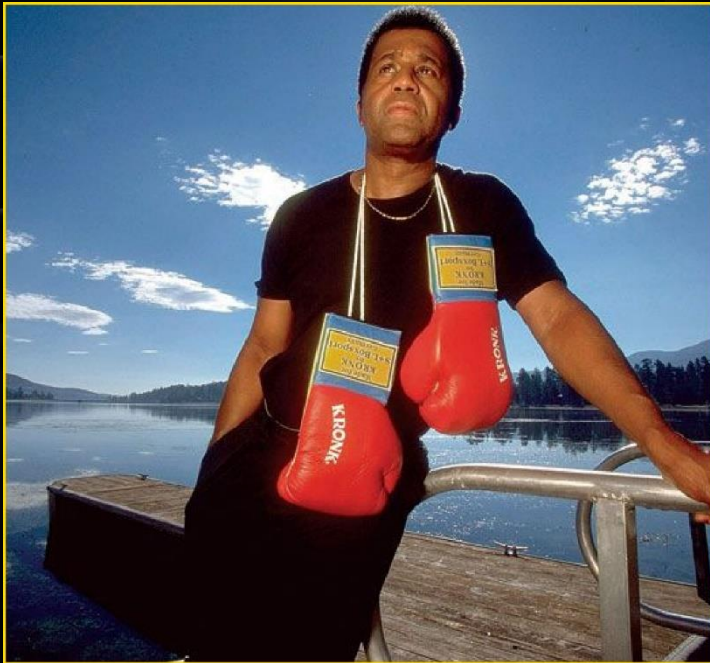


From Jack Blackburn and the Brown Bomber to the current Heavyweight Champion Tyson Fury, every era of boxing has had Detroit's fingerprints on it. Detroiters Eddie Futch and Emanuel Steward trained 61 world champions by themselves. Add their disciples like Freddie Roach and adopted sons like Jake LaMotta and Sugar Ray Robinson, and the legacy becomes epic.

The single thread that tied the city together with all the great champions was Emanuel Steward and the Kronk Gym



From Brewster-Wheeler to Lasky to Kronk... it has always been Detroit's legendary Rec Centers that captured the young potential and cultivated greatness



We will tell this story with the help of the men who had the front row seats for the last six decades of Detroit Boxing



The Storylines of “Rumble Young Man Rumble”

- Jack Blackburn arrives in Detroit (after serving time for murder) and begins training the great Joe Louis.
- The Brown Bomber spars with Eddie Futch at Brewster Center while a young Sugar Ray Robinson watches intently.
- Jake LaMotta adopts Detroit as his hometown and defeats Sugar Ray Robinson in the city where he grew up.
- A young Emanuel Steward wins the Golden Gloves and learns from Eddie Futch and all the Detroit legends.
- As Futch moves west, Steward takes over the Detroit boxing scene and settles at the Kronk rec center gym.
- Thomas “The Hitman” Hearns rises up to set a record for world championship weight class belts.
- The Goldfather begins and Kronk becomes the greatest boxing team in history.
- The 1984 Olympic Boxing team revolts against their coach and sneaks away to Big Bear with Manny Steward.
- Detroit corruption infiltrates Kronk and takes down the gym.
- Steward takes Detroit global with international champions.
- With Steward’s untimely passing, Javan Sugar Hill takes over the Kronk stable and wins the Heavyweight title training Tyson Fury.

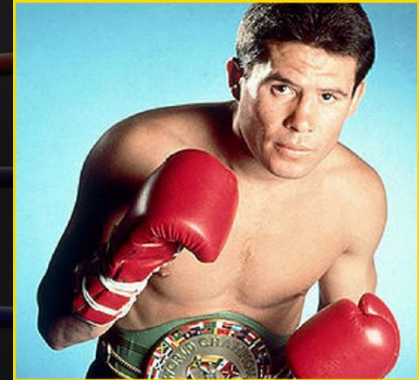
